Our 2nd meeting on October 10th will focus on the design plans the city has prepared for us. As well as our Adopt a Park agreement so that we can get everything in line for APF Grant approval. These grants will assist us in outfitting the park, but they require "sweat equity". It's important that we start drumming up interest throughout our neighborhood. Letting as many people as we can know about the process we are involved in. Many hands make light work!

The Park Committee is organizing a door-to-door information posse. In an effort to invite people to become involved and to inform them. 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# One Mile at a Time

Three months ago I had a dear friend who, at the age of 25, was dying. Three months ago I was devastated and hopeless. Three months ago, I signed up to train for a half marathon with The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's Team in Training program, because I didn't know what else to do. And now, my life is changed.

You may have seen me around. We have such a friendly neighborhood, so there's a good chance we've waved as you're walking your dog, or mowing your lawn or driving by in your car. I'm new to running and new to the neighborhood, so as I hit the concrete and push the limits of my endurance, I'm also exploring my new surroundings and enjoying the presence of the people around me.


Team in Training has been, to say the least, an incredible experience for me. The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS) is the world's largest voluntary health organization dedicated to funding blood cancer research and providing education and patient services. More than \$600 million has been invested in research since 1949 – more than \$71 million in 2008 - specifically targeting leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma. Last year alone, LLS made 6.3 million contacts with patients, caregivers and healthcare professionals. Over the past 20

years, Team In Training (TNT) has grown to become an unparalleled sports training program. More than 389,000 participants, from first timers to seasoned athletes, have trained with the Team and achieved their best at marathons, half marathons, triathlons, bike rides and hiking adventures.

I joined with TNT in May to raise money for LLS, and three months later, it's a part of my life I can't imagine living without. One mile at a time, the streets in our neighborhood begin to feel like home. One mile at a time, I learn I'm capable of more than I ever thought I was. And thanks to the

Team in Training, one mile at a time, lives are being saved.

# **Spider Mites**

It's hot. It's dry. It's a perfect time for spider mites! Spider mites are common plant pests that are found on the under side of leaves. Their feeding can cause leaves to discolor, causing a speckled appearance. With severe infestations, the plant leaves discolor to a silver or bronze color which may result in the leaves dropping from the plant.

Spider mites are arachnids, closely related to spiders and ticks. Similar to spiders, spider mites can produce silk and often cover leaves with webbing, especially when there are large populations. The webbing helps to protect the mites and their eggs from natural enemies and harsh environmental conditions.

The mites are able to develop more quickly when temperatures are warmer, so populations can grow very quickly. Spider mites thrive in dry conditions. Their natural enemies require more humid conditions, so dry conditions allow spider mite populations to grow with little predation or parasitism that would keep the population at an acceptable level.

There are many predatory arthropods that feed on spider mites. Some of these include predatory mites, spider mite destroyers (a type of ladybug), minute pirate bugs, big-eyed bugs and predatory thrips. Proper watering of plants may also help to reduce spider mite outbreaks as watering plants can help reduce stress brought on by drought. Using strong jets of water to hose plants can also help to dislodge spider mites on infested plants. Miticides or acaricides can be used to manage spider mite outbreaks. Look for active ingredients such as horticultural oils, insecticidal soaps, abamectin, bifenthrin, dimethoate or acephate.

# **New Cell Phone Law**

"I'll Have to Call You Back; I'm in a School Zone."

THE LAST SESSION OF THE TEXAS LEGISLATURE PASSED A NEW LAW MAKING IT ILLEGAL TO USE YOUR CELL PHONE IN A SCHOOL ZONE. THE EXCEPTIONS ARE:

- if you are using a hands free device
- if your vehicle is stopped
- if you are calling 911 for an emergency.

The law took effect September 1, 2009. Soon you can expect to see new signage in school zones reminding drivers to hang up or face a fine of up to \$200.
