SLNA/Unity Church Food Drive

Starting this month, SLNA & Unity Church will host a Food Drive for Caritas of Austin. (See their website at www.caritasofaustin.org.) Since 1964. Caritas of Austin has dedicated itself to one mission assisting with basic needs such as food, rent and utility assistance in times of financial crisis. Caritas envisions a community of hope, respect and self-reliance. Caritas works to prevent homelessness and hunger by assisting low-income community members and refugees with basic needs and promoting self-sufficiency. Through Basic Needs and Self-Sufficiency Services, Caritas will serve more than 15,000 Travis County adults and children this year.

Bring non-perishable foods and/or baby supplies to the SLNA meetings, or deliver them to the church office for up to two weeks after each meeting (i.e., April 21 - May 5; June 16-30, etc.). Caritas is most interested in non-perishable food items:

- Canned meats and fish
- Rice
- Beans (pinto, black, etc.)
- Macaroni & cheese
- Peanut butter
- Canned fruits
- Canned vegetables
- Soups
- Cereal
- Powdered and/or evaporated milk
- Pop-top items (e.g. tuna, beans, fruit) and Infant supplies
- Baby formula Infamile Lipil
- Baby diapers large size, 4-6

From the President — Developments in the 'Hood

Neighborhood Planning: The latest news from the City about the future of our Neighborhood Plan ("NP") is basically "no news". We have stopped trying to anticipate "our turn". With every NP that has been done, the City has changed the process. While it is called a "neighborhood plan", involvement is not exclusive to the neighborhood association and its membership. Every owner of any property that lies within the boundaries drawn by the City for our NP — whether commercial or residential, in a neighborhood association or not — will be mailed a notice from the City's Neighborhood Planning & Zoning Dept. when it is ready to start working with us. Every individual has the right and responsibility to get involved from the beginning, as it is a cumulative process. Every notice received by the SLNA officers will be posted on SLNA's website, but please do not wait for us to keep you informed. Everyone with internet access can see what to expect by going to the City's Neighborhood Planning website at www.ci.austin.tx.us/zoning/overview np.htm. It is going to be a major undertaking, and we will need all the participation we can get!

Bluebonnet Lane: The Walgreens project seems to be stuck in the approval process but is definitely still on track. The upgrades to Bluebonnet will be the first stage, and we anticipate a significant impact for our residents wanting to go south on Lamar, since that is our only protected left turn. I hope to know more by the time of our meeting. It is Site Plan Case # SP-04-1053C, if you want to research it online or call the Case Manager, Sue Welch, at 974-3294.

Richard Coons, hoping to develop the balance of the trailer park, will be at the April 21 meeting to share and explain his plans for a "Mixed Use" development. A summary from the committee's meeting with him, as well as the preliminary site plan itself, can be viewed at www.southlamar.org/city_notices.htm. If his plan is approved by the City, there will be one residential driveway onto Bluebonnet. Commercial traffic will use the two Walgreens entrances. After his presentation (and departure), we will discuss it, and current members (2005 dues paid or waiver renewed by April 11) will vote on an official position that SLNA officers will represent to the City at the zoning hearings.

I urge everyone who is remotely invested in the development of this property to attend, and anyone wanting their position to be represented to Council, be sure your membership is current. If you aren't sure, contact SLNA Treasurer Don Ewalt.

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Inspecting for Termites

Subterranean termites are the most destructive pest of wood in the United States, causing more than \$2 billion in damage each year. Termites are beneficial, breaking down wood materials that otherwise would accumulate, but when termites move into homes or other structures, they be-



come a problem. A thorough inspection yearly can detect a termite problem and be used to determine if treatment is required; this inspection may be done by the property owner or a professional. Outside:

- Inspect around garages, porches, patios, sidewalks
- Inspect foundation for mud tubes
 - Foundations should have 6-8 inches exposed for visual inspection
- Check for standing water or moist soil next to the structure
 - These areas should be corrected so moisture does not sit near the structure
- Check window and door frames; pipe penetrations
- Inspect roof eaves & gutters for leaks
- Inspect siding for decay or rot
- Check all wood to soil contact for termites or mud tubes
- If house on pier & beam- inspect crawl space area for mud tubes going up beams Inside:
- Inspect baseboards, wood floors, window & door facings
- Check any known expansion joints or cracks in the slab
- Look for blistering of paint or wall surfaces
- Inspect plumbing, including the bath trap
 - If there is no bath trap, cut an access to periodically inspect plumbing
- Inspect attic for mud tubes, water leaks or wood rot
