Neighborhood Planning Update...

The South Lamar Combined (Zilker, Galindo, Barton, & South Lamar) Neighborhood Planning process is in month six of at least eighteen. Over 750 interested parties are registered, with ten or so new requests weekly, and an average of 60-100 turn out for monthly meetings. Mark Walters, Sr. Zoning Planner (mark.walters@ci.austin.tx.us and 974-7695) calls ours a "great turnout!" The working draft of our Visions and Goals Statement, developed through these meetings, is on the City's web site www.ci.austin.tx.us/ zoning/downloads/southlamar vg.pdf. This document will guide the ultimate recommendations to City Council on future land use, transportation, and recreational spaces throughout our 'hood and surrounding corridors, e.g. South Lamar and Manchaca.

Walters describes us as still at the beginning of the Neighborhood Planning process. That means there's still time to get on board! We have developed our laundry list of issues, but they have not been prioritized. That task will be addressed in future meetings. One such issue will be identifying "transportation gaps" that may necessitate additional pedestrian and bicycle arteries or bus routes, enabling us to access businesses without always driving to them.

Though the SLCNP group may not continue to meet regularly once our plan is fully established, we will be invited to provide input on other projects that affect the entire City.

and assists Central Texans in growing organic food Volunteers help build gardens at homes, community gardens. centers, and schools for people who lack access to nutritious food due to income, disability, age, etc. They also educate on the benefits and methods of organic gardening and hold biannual skills workshops open to the public.

Last year, GCP built twelve new gardens at homes in Austin, and we started school-gardening programs at Metz Elementary and Blackshear Elementary schools. In 2006, we hope to expand our capacity to bring nutritious, affordable food to folks all over Austin by building 20 new gardens each season.

According to city ordinance, (www.ci.austin.tx.us/zoning/ front yd parking.htm) that means a person may not park a motor vehicle in the front yard or side yard of a residential property, except in: (1) a driveway; or (2) a paved parking space depicted on an approved site plan.


The standard parking violation of front or side yard of a residential property is \$40.00. Early payment reduces the fine to \$20.00.
