


Tapestry Dance Company Moves to South Austin!

Oak Leaf Roller

Some people are already seeing oak leaf rollers. While I'm hoping that the ice storm we had in Jan. wiped out some eggs, I'm sure there will be a few lingering caterpillars.

Oak leaf rollers are the yellowish-green caterpillars with a dark brown head capsule that dangle from silken thread on oak trees. They usually show up when the oaks leaf out in spring. Some nurseries recommend releasing Trichogramma wasps. Since they parasitize only the egg stage, so should be released before you see the caterpillars. Horticultural oils may also be used on the egg stage.

Once the caterpillars emerge, Bacillus thruingiensis variety kurstaki may be used. Bt targets only caterpillars, though it does not differentiate between pest caterpillars and those that people enjoy having, such as ones that become butterflies. When using Bt, good coverage is key because the caterpillars need to consume a lethal amount of the toxin.

Other possible control methods would be active ingredients such as spinosad (spinosyns) or carbaryl.

We're looking for a few good homes interested in hosting a foreign exchange student for the school year of 2007-2008!


